Subject:

- i) Eastern end of the monsoon Trough shifted closed to the foothills of the Himalayas and western end runs north of its normal Position.
- ii) Current spell of Weak monsoon conditions over the country likely to continue till next 5-6 days outside Northeast and adjoining east India, northern parts of Uttar Pradesh and Bihar where current activities of intense rainfall spell likely to continue during the same period.

Heavy rainfall stations of India as reported today morning (based upon rainfall Amount recorded (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday 0830 hours IST of today) (7 cm or more): Mawsynram-25; Cherrapunji-22; Nainital-18; Bhind-17; Kheri-16; Damoh, Panna-15 each; Tiruvallur-14; Hamirpur, Trichy-12 each; Banda, Agra, Sheopur-11; Dholpur, Katni, Williamnagar, Pashighat-10 each; Vaniaymbadi, Garhwal Pauri, Gonda, Mahoba, Bhojpur, Buxar, Sitamarhi, Dantewada-9 each; Rewa, Dausa, Basti, Rai Bareilly, Etah, Khliehriat, Shahabad-8 each; Shahdol, Narsinghpur, Chengalpattu, Kancheepuram, Kangra, Bharatpur, Udham Singh Nagar, Ghazipur, Bilaspur, Vaikom, Moradabad, Thrissur-7 each.

Weather Systems:


- Eastern end of the Monsoon Trough continues to run close to the foothills of the Himalayas while western end runs north of its normal position.
- A cyclonic circulation lies over Bihar and extends upto mid-tropospheric levels.

Forecast and warning:

- Current spell of Fairly widespread to widespread rainfall activity with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** very likely to continue over northeast and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during next 5 days. **Isolated extremely heavy falls** also likely over Assam & Meghalaya during 10th to 13th August.
- Fairly widespread to widespread rainfall with isolated heavy falls very likely to continue over East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand and Gangetic West Bengal during next 4-5 days. Isolated very heavy falls over Bihar on 11th & 12th August.
- Fairly widespread to widespread rainfall with isolated heavy falls very likely over Uttarakhand on 13th & 14th and over Himachal Pradesh during 12th 14th August.
- Subdued rainfall very likely over rest parts of plains of northwest India (Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan), adjoining central India and most parts of Peninsular India(outside Tamilnadu and Kerala), including Maharashtra & Gujarat state.
- Scattered to fairly widespread rainfall very likely over Tamilnadu and Kerala during next 5 days with **isolated heavy falls** over Tamilnadu during next 5 days and over Kerala during next 2 days.


