Subject: i) Moderate to severe thunderstorms accompanied with gusty winds, hail, lightning likely over Northwest India during 13th-15th with peak intensity on 13th & 14th April, 2024.

ii) Moderate thunderstorms accompanied with gusty winds, hail, lightning and light to moderate rainfall spell likely to continue over Central India on today and decrease significantly thereafter.

#### Realised weather during past 24 hours till 0830 hours IST of today: (details in Annexure I)

- **Hailstorm occurred** at isolated places over Madhya Pradesh and Marathwada.
- **Thundersquall/gusty winds** observed at isolated places over Madhya Pradesh and Vidarbha.
- ❖ Thunderstorm observed at many places over Vidarbha, Kerala & Mahe; at some parts of Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Interior Karnataka and at isolated places over Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, Jharkhand, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Coastal Karnataka and Coastal Andhra Pradesh.

## Weather Systems and Forecast & Warnings: (Annexure II)

- An intense **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation lies over Iran with a trough aloft in middle & upper tropospheric westerlies roughly along long. 56°E to the north of lat. 34°N. High moisture feeding from Arabian Sea is likely into Northwest India during 13th-15th April. A cyclonic circulation lies over south Rajasthan & adjoining north Gujarat and a trough runs from this cyclonic circulation to north Odisha in lower tropospheric levels. A cyclonic circulation lies over Comorin area & neighbourhood in lower tropospheric levels and a trough/wind discontinuity runs from this cyclonic circulation to Konkan and Goa in lower tropospheric levels. Under the influence of the above weather systems:
  - ✓ Fairly widespread to widespread light to moderate rainfall/snowfall with **thunderstorm**, **lightning** & gusty winds (30-40 kmph) over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand during 13<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> April, 2024.
  - ✓ Scattered to fairly widespread rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (30-40 kmph)** very likely over West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi and Rajasthan during 13<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> April, 2024.
  - ✓ Isolated to scattered light/moderate rainfall accompanied with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (30-40 kmph)** very likely over Kerala & Mahe, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry-Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka, Telangana, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal and Andaman & Nicobar Islands and with **gusty winds (40-50 kmph)** very likely over interior Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh on 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup> April.
  - ✓ **Isolated hailstorm very likely over** Jammu and Kashmir, Rajasthan and East Madhya Pradesh on 13<sup>th</sup>; Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana and *West Madhya Pradesh* on 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup> and Uttarakhand & West Uttar Pradesh on 14<sup>th</sup> April.
  - ✓ *Isolated heavy rainfall/snowfall* very likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 13<sup>th-</sup> 15<sup>th</sup> and Himachal Pradesh on 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> April, 2024.
  - ✓ **Dust storm/thundersquall** (50-60 kmph) very likely over Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh today.
  - ✓ **Strong surface winds (30-40 kmph)** very likely to prevail over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi and Uttar Pradesh during 16<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> April, 2024.

- ❖ A cyclonic circulation lies over central Assam & neighbourhood and another over northeast Assam in lower tropospheric levels. Under its influence:
  - ✓ Scattered to fairly widespread light/moderate rainfall/snowfall with isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** very likely over Arunachal Pradesh; isolated to scattered light to moderate rainfall with isolated **thunderstorm**, **lightning & gusty winds** over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during next 7 days.
  - ✓ Isolated heavy rainfall very likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam on 16th & 17th April, 2024.

#### Maximum temperature observation and forecast for next 5 days:

- ❖ Yesterday, maximum temperatures are in the range of 40-42°C over many parts of West Rajasthan; at isolated places over Saurashtra & Kutch, Rayalaseema and Madhya Maharashtra. These are above normal by 2-4 °C over West Rajasthan.
- ❖ Gradual fall by 2-4°C very likely over Northwest India during next 2 days and no significant change thereafter.
- No significant change in maximum temperatures very likely over Central & south peninsular India and Gujarat State during next 2 days and gradual rise by 2-4°C during subsequent 3 days.
- ❖ No significant change in maximum temperatures very likely over many parts of West India during next 24 hours and gradual rise by 3-4°C during subsequent 4 days.
- ❖ Gradual rise by 3-5°C very likely over many parts of East India during next 4-5 days.
- ❖ No significant change in maximum temperatures very likely over rest parts of the country.


#### Heat wave, Warm Night and Hot & Humid weather warning for next 5 days:


- ❖ Hot and humid weather very likely to prevail over Kerala & Mahe, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 13<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup>; over, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup>; Gujarat State and Coastal Karnataka during 15<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup> and Gangetic West Bengal on 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> April, 2024.
- ❖ Heat Wave conditions likely over Odisha and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 15th-17th April, 2024.

Impact expected and action suggested due to thunderstorm accompanied with lightning/gusty winds & Hailstorm over East Madhya Pradesh, Jammu, Rajasthan on 13th; West Madhya Pradesh Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana on 13th & 14th and Uttarakhand & West Uttar Pradesh on 14th April.

#### Impact expected:

- Strong wind/hail may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Hail may injure people and cattle at open places.
- ❖ Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls and huts.
- Loose objects may fly.

#### **Action suggested:**

- Stay indoors, close windows & doors and avoid travel if possible.
- \* Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees.
- ❖ Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls.
- Unplug electrical/ electronic appliances.
- Immediately get out of water bodies.
- ❖ Keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

# Impact & Action Suggested due to heavy rainfall over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 13<sup>th-</sup> 15<sup>th</sup> and Himachal Pradesh on 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> April, 2024.

#### **Impacts Expected for Rain/Snow**

- Disruption of Electricity.
- Landslide, rock fall and mudslides, Blocking/washout of roads/highways/bridges Nallahs.
- Disruption of traffic flow.
- Damage to Kuccha and unsecured structures.

#### **Suggested Actions**

- Avoid roadway underpasses, drainage ditches, low lying areas and areas where water collects they can unexpectedly flood or overflow.
- Stay away from power lines or electrical wires.
- ❖ Don't stay in kuchcha houses during heavy rainfall as it may collapse anytime soon.
- Drive carefully.

#### **IMPACT & ACTION SUGGESTED due to Heat Wave Conditions:**

### Yellow alert Areas (Odisha and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam)


- ❖ Moderate temperature & heat is tolerable for general public but moderate health concern likely for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases.
- Avoid heat exposure.
- ❖ Wear lightweight, light colour, loose, cotton clothes.
- Cover your head, use a cloth, hat or umbrella.

# Agromet advisories for Heavy Rainfall, Gusty Winds, Hailstorm and Heat Wave likely over various parts of the country

- ➤ Harvest Withhold harvesting of mustard and pulses in Jammu & Kashmir; mustard in Himachal Pradesh; wheat and mustard in Punjab and wheat in Haryana. Keep the already harvested crop at safer places.
- ➤ Undertake immediate harvesting of matured mustard, wheat and barley in Uttarakhand; wheat and mustard in West Uttar Pradesh and keep the harvested produce at safer places.
- ➤ Harvest the matured crops, fruits and vegetables during clear weather and keep the harvested produce at safer places or cover the heaps of harvested produce in the fields with tarpaulin sheets in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh.
- ➤ Use hail nets or hail caps in fruit orchards to prevent mechanical damage and provide mechanical support to horticultural crops & Damp; staking to vegetables in North-West India and Madhya Pradesh.
- Make necessary arrangements for draining out excess water from crop fields to avoid water stagnation in Tamil Nadu, Jammu & Kashmir and Himachal Pradesh.

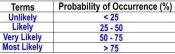
